NORTH HALL FIRE SAFETY PROCEDURE

IN THE EVENT OF AN ALARM CONDITION IN NORTH HALL EVACUATE THE BUILDING VIA THE NEAREST EMERGENCY EXIT AND BE SURE TO TAKE ALL OF YOUR PERSONAL BELONGINGS WITH YOU.

In the event of an emergency evacuation, when it has been determined that is safe to do so, physically challenged individuals can be evacuated out of the building with the use of an evacuation chair by trained Fire Safety personnel. Evacuation chairs are located on each floor inside the Areas of Refuge. In the event a physically challenged individual cannot be safely evacuated from the building, he or she will be directed or escorted to the designated area of refuge. In the North Hall building the following rooms have been designated as Areas of Refuge: Rooms 4101, 3326 and 2400. The area of refuge is an area of the floor in which an individual can seek refuge, since the type of construction is designed to prevent the rapid spread of fire. The door shall be swinging and self-closing, with a minimum fire protection rating of one and one-half hours. The rooms must have a window to the street, a telephone, special ventilation, and a fire rated wall construction. The door should be closed first, prior to opening the window. Individuals shall remain in the area of refuge until the arrival of the Fire Department for rescue.
