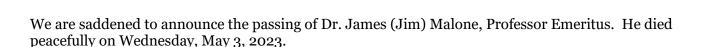

RE: Passing of Dr. James Malone



Jim, as he was known college wide, became a member of the John Jay community in 1970, and his long service included 11 years as Dean of Students. In that role, he helped create the student government charter. Dr. Jim Malone began in the Search for Education, Elevation and Knowledge (SEEK) program as SEEK Director. He also held several other positions while at John Jay and was the College's first Vice President of Administrative Affairs. He was also a member of the Faculty Senate and a Faculty Member in the Counseling Department. He retired after 41 years of CUNY service and was granted the rank of Professor Emeritus.

In recognition of a \$100,000.00 scholarship the Malone's awarded to John Jay College, President Travis presented a petition to the Board of Directors to name the John Jay College Student Government Conference Room in their honor.

As a testament to their belief in the John Jay College mission "Educating for Justice," and their desire to leave a lasting legacy, the James and Rubie Malone Scholarship was established. His gift to an institution that Jim Malone termed "a college I love" was intended to inspire and support student leaders. "By becoming leaders, you thereby fulfill the American dream," he said.

Dr. Malone was a beloved Athlete, a Mentor to countless students and faculty, especially faculty of color. He was always "dapper" and well respected by everyone.
