Graduating Student Survey Class of 2022

The Graduating Student Survey was administered May-July 2022 to the class of 2022 via a Web link sent by email in the invitation to participate. It was launched a week before graduation, May 31, 2022. After several reminders, the survey closed the fourth week of July.

This report summarizes responses to questions on students' perceptions of their educational experiences at John Jay. There are questions on faculty and advising, personal and intellectual development, and current employment as well as future plans for employment or continuing education.

Administration of this survey preceded the availability of the names and contact information in the IRDB, this office's database. Therefore, we relied on the registrar's office to provide us with the list of students in the graduating class. Their list contained 4348 students: 302 certificate and advanced certificate recipients, 3354 bachelor's degree recipients, and 692 master's degree recipients. Those responding to the survey were 3 certificate's recipients, 298 bachelor's degree recipients, and 82 master's degree recipients. Data for graduates from dual (BA/MA) degree programs were counted twice; once with the bachelor's degree graduates and once with master's degree graduates.

Table's 1 - 11 show graduating students' responses separately by degree earned.

Key Findings:

- Master's Degree Graduates:
 - 56% of graduates report they completed a capstone experience. Among these graduates 50% report they completed a thesis or final paper.
 - 73% of graduates report they were accepted into a program for further study. Among these graduates, 54% report they were accepted into a doctoral degree program.
 - \circ 10% of graduates applied to programs related to their major.
 - 47% of graduates highly rate their overall experience at John Jay, and also 60% would choose to attend it again.
- Bachelor's Degree Graduates:
 - 82% of graduates report they completed a capstone experience. Of these graduates, 69% report they completed a thesis or final paper.
 - 65% of graduates report they were accepted into a program for further study. Among these graduates, 73% report they were accepted into a master's degree program.
 - \circ 18% of graduates applied to programs related to their major.
 - 55% of graduates highly rate their overall experience at John Jay, and 61% would choose to attend it again.

- Certificate's Graduates:
 - 0% of graduates report they completed a capstone experience.
 - o 100% of graduates report they were accepted into a program for further study.
 - \circ 0% of graduates applied to programs related to their major.
 - 100% of graduates highly rate their overall experience at John Jay, and 100% would choose to attend it again.

The class of 2022 reports a very high percent of overall satisfaction with their John Jay College experience, and state that they would 'definitely' or 'probably' choose to attend the college again in the future.
