

## Create Discussion Board Thread

Discussion Board Forums are made up of individual discussion threads that are organized around a particular subject. Instructors create the forums and students create the discussion threads. A Discussion thread is a post of the student's individual thought on the questions being asked.

## To access the Discussion Board

1. In your course, select the **Discussion Board** link on the Course Menu.



*Note:* Some instructors might create Discussion Board tool links with a content area. These links will bring you to the Discussion Board page as well.

2. On the Discussion Board page, select the Forum Name in blue.

1. Within the Forum, select the **Create Thread** button in the upper left.
