WHAT WILL YOU LEARN IN THIS MAJOR?

The Political Science major is designed to enhance your knowledge of politics, policy, governance, and government ranging from a global to a local perspective. It will help you become a more knowledgeable citizen capable of reasoned judgments on political issues and ideas.

Political Science includes a number of subfields. Topics of study include the role of law and courts in the functioning of government; comparative examinations of different political systems; and theories of the interactions between nations. In addition, you will be exposed to concepts of justice, citizenship, and participation, among others.

FIRST COURSES IN THE MAJOR ■■■

Political Science (POL) 101: American Government and Politics provides an essential foundation for all other courses in this major.

Students in the POL major are able to choose courses from five areas: Law, Courts & Politics, Political Theory, Urban Politics & Public Policy, International/ Comparative, American Politics. They can focus more on one area if they like, or pick from a variety of areas, depending on their interests.
